



The Fifth Caucasus Mathematical Olympiad will take place on **March 13-18, 2020, in Maykop, Republic of Adygea** <http://cmo.adygmath.ru/>.

The organizers of the Olympiad are Ministry of Education and Science of the Republic of Adygea and Caucasus Mathematical Center at Adyghe State University.

The Caucasus Mathematical Olympiad was founded in 2015. The first Olympiad took place in the 2015–2016 academic year at the Education center “Sirius” (Sochi, Russian Federation).

The goal of the Olympiad is to create a cultural and educational space that unites regions of Southern Russia and countries of the Caucasus region and the Black Sea, to form and strengthen friendships among schoolchildren who are interested in Math from Russia and other countries.

The Caucasus Mathematical Olympiad consists of two age leagues:

- Junior League: students of Grades 8–9 of schools in Russia and students of equivalent grades in participating countries;
- Senior League: students of Grades 10–11 of schools in Russia and students of equivalent grades in participating countries.

The Problem Selection Committee of the Olympiad consists of the members of Problem Selection Committees of the Russian Mathematical Olympiad, Bulgarian National Mathematical Olympiad, Iranian Mathematical Olympiad, and Luxembourg Mathematical Olympiad.

The participation in the Olympiad is free of charge. The Olympiad organizers cover all the accommodation and food expenses for the Olympiad participants and all expenses for one leader of each delegation.

The Olympiad organizers do not cover transportation expenses to travel to and from the Olympiad.

The Coordination Council invites students of Grades 8–11 of 15 regions in Southern Russia (Southern and North-Caucasus Federal Districts) and students of equivalent grades in other countries to participate in the Olympiad.

We invite:

- Winners and award recipients of the final round of the Russian Mathematical Olympiad among Grades 9–10 in the 2018–2019 school year, school students of Southern Russia who won in the final round of the Euler Olympiad in the 2018–2019 school year, students in Grades 9, 10, and 11 who won in the regional rounds of the Russian Mathematical Olympiad in 2019–2020 or in the regional rounds of the Euler Olympiad in the Southern Russia in 2018–2019.

- Students of participating countries who are winners and award recipients of the regional and final rounds of the National Mathematical Olympiads in their countries.

Apart from the competition, the program of the Olympiad will introduce participants to the nature, history, and culture of Adygea; the program will include popular lectures on Math and Natural Sciences, as well as various cultural and sport events.

The number of participants in a delegation from a participating country is four students and one leader.

The deadline for participants from the countries with a visa-free entry to the Russian Federation is **February 23, 2020**.

Participants who need visas to enter the Russian Federation should apply by **February 01, 2020**.
